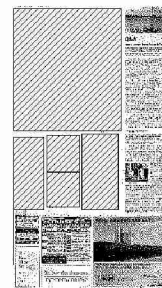
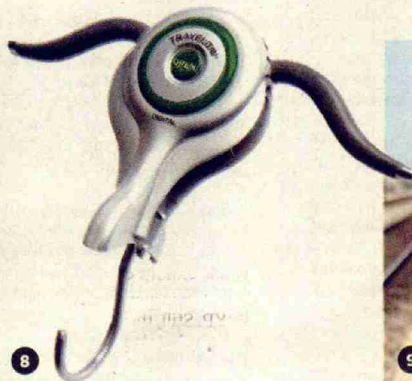
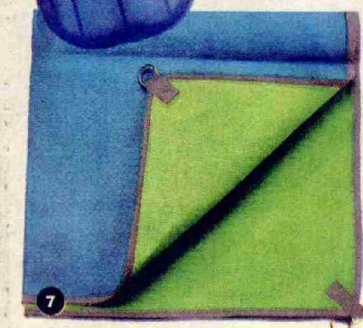
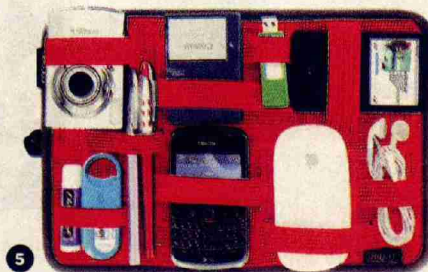
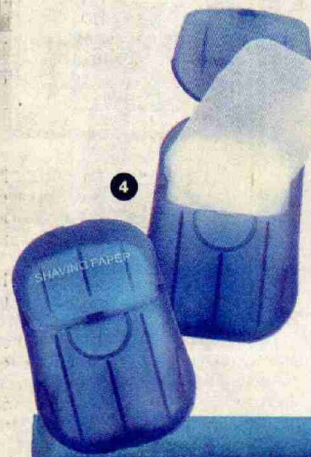


Holiday Gifts For a Globetrotter

8 For the Over-Packer
